

## GREEN TRAVEL

1. Students qualified for partial study mobility abroad under the Erasmus+ KA 131 program may apply for a one-time allowance of EUR 50 for travel using low-emission means of transport (e.g. bus, train, car sharing).
2. The basic condition for obtaining the “**GREEN TRAVEL**” allowance is making at **round trip** using the above-mentioned means of transport.
3. Persons whose travel to the partner university will be made by low-emission means of transport (e.g. bus, rail, car) apply for the “**GREEN TRAVEL**” grant. Before concluding the contract, a **signed declaration** should be sent to the appropriate mobility coordinator at the International Programmes Office.
4. Students traveling by bus or train must provide scans of the invoices / tickets confirming their travel no later than two weeks after the end of the mobility. Other persons should provide different confirmation of using a low-emission means of transport (e.g. a copy of a fuel receipt, a copy of vignette).
5. The one-time allowance for “**GREEN TRAVEL**” will be paid together with the other components of the Erasmus+ scholarship in accordance with the submitted **declaration** and the regulations contained in the financial agreement (80% of the grant is paid after signing the agreement, and the remaining 20%, after submission and approval of the student exchange documents).
6. The date on the attached invoice / ticket / declaration may not coincide with the date of the mobility (dates as stated in the financial agreement); also, the travel may not occur more than one month (30 days) before the start of the mobility, or one month (30 days) after the end of the mobility (the exception is the starting / finishing date of travel, which may be the same as the mobility starting / finishing date);
7. For “**GREEN TRAVEL**”, students are entitled to receive individual support towards living expenses up to a maximum of 4 additional days.
8. The two-way travel distance will be calculated on the basis of the “EC Distance Calculator”, where the starting point is the CUE Campus in Krakow, and the finishing point is the campus of the host university:
  - 1 km – 499 km – 1 day
  - 500 km – 999 km – 2 days
  - 1000 km – 1999 km – 3 days
  - 2000 km or more – 4 days
9. If the travel is not confirmed in the above-mentioned manner, the student will be requested to pay back the amount resulting from the “**GREEN TRAVEL**” entitlements (additional EUR 50 plus individual support).
