

## Visas and consular affairs

**Albania:** Schengen - without visa up to 3 months - passport valid for at least 6 months.

**Bosnia and Herzegovina:** visa-free - passport valid for a minimum of 6 months.

**Kosovo:** citizens of Kosovo need a visa to enter Poland and the Schengen area. Information on the visa procedure is available at <https://www.gov.pl/web/severnamakedonija/visa-information>

Visa applications are registered through the system [www.e-konsulat.gov.pl](http://www.e-konsulat.gov.pl)

Due to high interest, please register your application well in advance of your planned stay in Poland.

**Azerbaijan:** Azerbaijani citizens are subject to visa requirements. If travelling for about a week, they should obtain a Schengen visa, their passport must be valid for at least six months after entering Poland. In addition, I would like to point out that, due to the fact that Azerbaijani citizens are on the consultation list, it takes approximately 10 days to process a visa application.

**Georgia:** up to 90 days on the passport, but it is compulsory to have an invitation, medical insurance valid in the Republic of Poland, confirmation of accommodation and certificate of financial means for stay.

**Kazakhstan:** citizens of the Republic of Kazakhstan can cross the border on a valid passport with a visa. Information on the visa process can be found at the following link:
